Dear Chair Durbin, Ranking Member Grassley and Member Kennedy:

We are alumni of Tulane Law School, including many current Louisiana residents, and we write to convey our strongest support for the nomination of Nancy Abudu to join the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals. Ms. Abudu is exceptionally well qualified to serve on the court and will bring with her both deep experience in litigation before the court and a rich understanding of the Constitution and laws she will take an oath to uphold.

Tulane's motto is "Non sibi, sed suis," or "Not for oneself, but for one's own" and Ms. Abudu's professional career is a reflection of this devotion to uphold legal principles and serve the public. Ms. Abudu's trajectory includes early career positions as an associate at a large, traditional law firm and as a staff attorney at the Eleventh Circuit, where she experienced first-hand the distinct roles of the judges for whom she worked and the advocates who appeared before them. Throughout the years, Ms. Abudu has devoted her considerable energy and talents to upholding the rights of those for whom she advocated – from veterans and others with disabilities, to people of faith seeking religious accommodations and protection from discrimination, people experiencing homelessness, and people seeking to exercise the right to vote. If confirmed, we are confident that Ms. Abudu will uphold her oath as a judge with equal dedication by applying the Constitution and laws of our country in a fair, open-minded and impartial manner.
