Nominee: Jamal Whitehead for Federal District Court Vacancies in the Western District of Washington

Chair Durbin and Ranking Member Grassley, it is a privilege to be here to introduce Jamal Whitehead, an outstanding nominee for the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington, out of committee.
