





- 27. OMB Subcommittee: USA Loretta Lynch (E/NY), Chair of the OMB Subcommittee, reported on the following:
 - Administrative Officers (AOs) Working Group Report: The new chair of the AO Working Group is Marian Nelson (S/GA). The Administrative Staffing Study has been completed, but it was determined that due to the number of the elements which need to be reduced, more time is needed to monitor the data. The AO Working Group is collecting best practices and looking at the best way to disseminate to the field. Also, because of the budget, they are also looking at alternative ways to receive training such as accessing the NAC's "On Demand" training. They are also monitoring the PEP reports, looking at data storage, and monitoring the migration from Word Perfect to Word.
 - Attorney Hiring: Templates for announcing term/permanent and uncompensated SAUSAs are being prepared. Once approved by OARM, they will be presented to the OMB Subcommittee.
 - Contractor Data Call: Advisory/assistance services contracts that had been reduced by 15%, have changed to 5%.
 - Employee Viewpoint Survey: EOUSA came in 17 out of 240 in the Employee Viewpoint Survey. We were ranked 223 out of 228 with regard to family friendly culture and benefits. This was attributed to the fact that EOUSA does not have a telework policy.

ACTION ITEMS:

- <u>IRB Projects</u>: The AGAC adopted moving forward on the IRB Projects. See No. 28 for a comprehensive list.
- Telework Policy: EOUSA is in the process of developing a telework policy. Director Jarrett noted there are many facets of a proposed policy. Telework cannot be used if you are sick; certain staff will not be eligible. In EOUSA you will have to have an "outstanding" rating to qualify. The larger issue will be how to manage telework in your offices. The analysis starts with which jobs could be done by telework; then we look at the people performing these jobs. EOUSA is waiting for JMD's policy before finalizing its own. Once finalized it will be reviewed by the AGAC and sent to the USAs to use as a guide. [JMD's policy was received during the meeting; USA Rose reviewed and identified problematic areas; EOUSA is reviewing.]
- <u>I-Phones</u>: Mark Fleshman reported that he has reached out to the USAs on whether they want to transition to the I-Phone; 55 districts responded. There are costs involved, and the AGAC asked Mr. Fleshman to create a list of pros and cons, talk to the Administrative Officers, do a cost analysis, and report back to the AGAC in May.
- Reduce the Federal Foot Print: USA Lynch reported that a Presidential Memorandum dated June 10, 1010, calls on federal agencies to reduce costs and maximize use of the federal real property inventory. As a result, in the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) budget guidance there is a "No New Growth" policy and GSA and OMB scrutinizing all agency building plans, expecting utilization rate reductions in new and renewed leases. Office utilization rates are expected to be no larger than 130 square feet per person, and only 100 square feet for law enforcement field offices. Members expressed their concerns noting that a 130-square foot office would not accommodate the needs of an AUSA. USA Fishman expressed the need to have a USA involved in this issue. (Gugulis)





8. Health Care Benefits for Same Sex Partners: The Committee discussed the issue of providing health insurance benefits to same sex partners with USA Loretta Lynch (E/NY), Vice Chair, AGAC; USA Steve Dettelbach (N/OH), Chair, Civil Rights Subcommittee; Lee Lofthus, Assistant Attorney General for Administration, Justice Management Division (JMD); Art Gary, General Counsel, JMD; Barbara Bush, Deputy General Counsel, JMD; USA Anne Tompkins (W/NC); USA Laura Duffy (S/CA); and Richard Parker, Deputy Associate Attorney General for Diversity.

Jay Macklin, General Counsel, EOUSA briefed the group beforehand advising that on July 20, several rule changes have come down from the Office of Personnel Management that added benefits for same sex partners. Some of these included child-care subsidies and services and including same sex domestic partners in the list of relationships in which there is presumed to be an insurable interest. Health care benefits were not included. Mr. Macklin reported that health care benefits are prevented under the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) which defines a spouse as "a legal union between one man and one woman, and the word 'spouse' refers only to a person of the opposite sex who is a husband or wife." Mr. Macklin is seeking guidance on how to litigate these cases.


Members of the AGAC asked JMD if they had found anyway around this issue so that an employee can be reimbursed for having to pay out of personal funds, for example, through a retention bonus. Mr. Gary reported that the Department has been looking at this issue since 2009. At this time there are three cases in litigation with regard to DOMA and it is expected that the Supreme Court will take one of these cases in their next term. There is a lot of interest from OPM, but the interpretation of the statue is the problem. DOJ is a Title 5 agency, but non-Title 5 agencies have been able to provide a stipend to an employee to cover the additional cost. Because DOJ is a Title 5 agency, we come under different rules. Mr. Lofthus explained that in 2009 JMD was given a mission to expand the benefits to same sex partners. They have been successful except for 5 or 6 issues. At this time the only remedy available is for a person to go through the individual EEO complaint/grievance process. Members advised that if DOMA is struck down as unconstitutional, we need to be looking at what we can do to address this issue; for example, asking the Department's Office of Legal Counsel for a legal opinion on our options. There should be an internal DOJ policy, either to follow DOMA or how to address if DOMA is gone. And, to what extent does the Department want us to be an advocate with OPM with regard to a statutory change; and what, if not statutory should we be advocating for with OPM for a fix to this issue. Our employee suits are in the investigative stage with the EEOC. USAOs should reach out to Jay Macklin or Suzanne Bell if they have an issue in their office. (Jay Macklin/Suzanne Bell)










5. Stock Act:

- 6. OMB Subcommittee: USA Loretta Lynch (E/NY) reported on the recent OMB Subcommittee meeting. The following issues were addressed:
 - Cost of Toner: USA Lynch advised that there is an imbalance in the United States Attorneys' offices (USAOs) on the use of toner which results in an imbalance in the way a community-wide resource is being used. Approximately one third of the USAOs are using more; others are using less. The range of cost per user is as low as \$129 per FTE to as high as \$804 per FTE. The question is whether we should continue to fund the toner from USA community funds or should we have an "average" toner amount allocation per district, with the heavy users paying out of budget for the overage. The OMB Subcommittee recommended: to survey the field on why there is a discrepancy in the cost of toner among the districts; 2) identify creative ways to reduce the use of toner; and 3) have the EOUSA IT staff provide some guidance. OMB will revisit this issue in six months and make the decision on whether we are going to make a change in the way toner is made available.
 - Reduction in Space: USA Lynch reported that we continue to work through the issues raised by the President's "No Net New" growth policy and what that means for the Department. We have been asked to reduce our footprint to 130 sq. ft. per person. USA Lynch advised that EOUSA will be submitting a new proposal to JMD in the next few days which will reflect a 10% reduction in space. She also reported that USA David Hickton (W/PA) has been asked to be the USA POC on this issue with EOUSA.
 - Proposed USAP 3-4.300.005 Filling Critical Support Positions: USA Lynch reported that USAP 3-4.300.005 modifies some of the procedures for filling certain staff and administrative positions. An incorrect draft was circulated to the USAs for comment which appeared to shift selection authority from the field to EOUSA. This, however, was incorrect. The goal of the USAP is to bring the USAP into compliance with OPM with regard to the hiring requirements for 1811s which include physical and age requirements. The recommendation was made that the USAs review the USAP on the front end and circulate to the Administrative


- Officers Working Group for comment.
- Phased Retirement: OPM has issued a fact sheet on "phased retirement" which states that the main purpose of the plan is to enhance mentoring and training of employees who will be filling the positions of more experienced employees who are preparing for retirement. Participation would be voluntary for employees and agencies with certain categories of employees being excluded. The "phased retirement" proposal raises many concerns to include how health insurance and life insurance benefits would be handled, and if overtime would be allowed. At this time we are waiting for OMP regulations to be issued.
- Request for Overseas Travel: USA Carter Stewart advised that as the past chair and a member of the CEOS Working Group, he has been invited to speak on the issue of child exploitation and participate on other panels at the International Association of Prosecutors Conference in Bangkok, Thailand in late October. He also proposes to travel to Chaing Mai for an ICE briefing and tour of that city which is a major point of the American sex tourism industry. Neither IAP nor OPDAT are able to fund the trip. USA Carter advised that three other individuals from the Justice Department's Office of International Affairs, OPDAT and ENRD, are attending this conference as well. The total cost of the trip is \$5,000; USA Stewart's district is able to cover \$2500. USA Stewart is requesting \$2500 from AGAC funds for the remainder of the cost. USA Lynch advised that the OMB Subcommittee asked USA Stewart to explore all other possible sources of funding before requesting funds from the AGAC. USA Stewart advised that no other source is able to fund his request. The AGAC approved USA Carter's request of using \$2500 from AGAC funds for this trip.




Summary

(Draft Working Summary: 2/21/13 rev.)

1. Improving Communications: United States Attorney (USA) Loretta Lynch (E/NY), Chair of the AGAC, reported that she has three areas for the Committee to focus on at this meeting: 1) improving communications between the AGAC and their colleagues in the field; 2) making AGAC meetings with Department leadership more productive; and 3) developing the agenda for the United States Attorneys' Conference. To this end, she advised that the AGAC agenda will be emailed to all USAs before each meeting, and that the AGAC summary will be emailed to all USAs following the meeting. Ms. Lynch asked the USAs to reach out to their phone trees if they have an issue they would like addressed by the Committee or any ideas on improving communications. She thanked all the USAs for working so hard through the AGAC subcommittees and working groups; most recently, in responding to the firearms issue, immigration reform legislation, and revising the Department's Giglio policy.

Ms. Lynch advised that both the AG and DAG will be attending the USA conference which will provide the USAs the opportunity to have an interactive discussion with each of them. Both the AG and DAG are interested in big ticket items moving forward; what cases should we be doing, and how should we be measuring these cases; what should be a federal case; are we overlapping with state and locals. We need to identify our interests and align these interests with our resources. Are we better off than we were four years ago?

The Committee also discussed possible segments for the upcoming USA Conference to include: violent crime; a panel on the mass shooting that have recently taken place; assessing risk and lessons learned from Fast and Furious; a security segment; cyber issues; breathing life into the Holder memo; and a breakout on budget 101 and hiring.












HHS Secretary Kathleen Sebelius chairs the Council. There will be a meeting on May 13, 2013, and Mr. West is interested in any issues the USAs may have on elder abuse. (Lynch)
 - The <u>Justice Reinvestment Initiative</u> which is a project cosponsored by the Bureau
 of Justice Assistance and the Public Safety Performance Project of the Pew Center
 on the States. They collect and analyze data on factors that increase corrections
 populations and costs; identify and implement changes that address costs and
 achieve better outcomes; and measure the fiscal and public safety impacts of those

changes. Mr. West asked his staff to arrange for a briefing for the AGAC on this initiative. (Lynch)
