His laughter was contagious, his spirit irreplaceable. But most importantly, he was my son, and he was a father to two beautiful sons who must now grow up without their dad, all because of this poison that continues to flood our communities unchecked.

How many more families must be destroyed before we take decisive action? Fentanyl is unlike any other drug crisis we have faced—it is a weapon of mass destruction, killing Americans at an unprecedented rate. We cannot afford hesitation or political gamesmanship. Permanent scheduling is not just necessary; it is urgent.

I beg you, as a mother who will never see her son's smile again, do not let this bill be held up any longer. Do not allow more families to experience this unbearable loss. We need the HALT Fentanyl Act passed now, without amendments. Please, let my son's death—and the countless others like him—not be in vain.
