Dear Attorney General Barr and Inspector General Horowitz,

As you are aware, the Judiciary Committee has for some time been investigating matters related to the Justice Department's and the Federal Bureau of Investigation's handling of the Crossfire Hurricane investigation, including the applications for, and renewals of, a Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act warrant on Carter Page. As part of that investigation, it is critical that the Committee be provided with the names of the individuals whose names were redacted in the Office of the Inspector General's recent report on Crossfire Hurricane, especially those individuals who took part in interviews with Christopher Steele's primary sub-source. Although these names were redacted from the public version of the report, because the Privacy Act does not apply to matters within the jurisdiction of a congressional committee, I do not anticipate that production of these names to the Committee will present an issue.

Accordingly, I request that the Committee be provided with the names of, and the identifiers used in the report for, these individuals, along with their positions at the FBI or DOJ during their involvement in Crossfire Hurricane and their current positions, no later than Monday, December 23, 2019.

In addition, I request that the Department provide the Committee with the documents and communications listed in my letters of August 29, 2019, and March 7, 2019, to the extent access to those documents has not already been provided, no later than Monday, January 6, 2020.

Thank you for your prompt attention to my requests. If you have any questions about these requests, please have your staff contact Zachary Somers with the majority staff on the Committee.
