Dear Majority Leader Schumer, Minority Leader McConnell, Chairman Durbin and Ranking Member Grassley:

We write to express our strong support of the nomination of Todd Kim to be Assistant Attorney General for the Environment and Natural Resources Division in the U.S. Department of Justice. We are all professors who teach and write about environmental and natural resources law. Like most academics, we do not always agree. Indeed, we can sometimes sharply disagree in our legal analysis. But what we all share in common is a deep respect for the rule of law and for the essential public service performed by the attorneys of the Justice Department's Environment Division in enforcing and defending the nation's environmental protection and natural resource management laws. Many of us previously worked for the Environment Division, and we are all confident that Todd Kim will be an outstanding Assistant Attorney General to lead the Division.

Todd Kim offers all the necessary ingredients, professional and personal to serve as Assistant Attorney General. Professionally, Kim wonderfully combines enormous achievement, dedication to public service, proven leadership, private sector experience, and a deep expertise in environmental law. Kim graduated *magna cum laude* from both Harvard College and Harvard Law School and then clerked for the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia

Circuit. His first job after his clerkship was as an Honors Program Attorney in the Appellate Section of ENRD — the same Justice Department Division that President Biden has now named Kim to lead.

Kim enjoyed a stellar reputation at the Justice Department as a highly skilled appellate advocate, as underscored by EPA's decision to award Kim the Agency's Gold Medal. Working at the Environment Division for more than eight years under both Democratic and Republican Administrations, Kim developed a deep expertise in environmental law. He briefed and presented oral argument in federal courts of appeals on a wide variety of complex environmental and natural resources law cases. He was named the District of Columbia's first Solicitor General in 2006 and ably served in that office for eleven years until he joined a private law firm in 2018.

Notwithstanding his extraordinary achievements, Kim never displays a hint of arrogance or undue self-confidence.
